My mother said I had fits but I don't know when I do have them. - Then my parents moved out on Princes Road and I went to work for Col Phelps for three or four weeks - Don't recollect whether I had fits while with him. Then I came back home, but did not work any for three months on account of being disabled by my wrist side and those fits. - I know I went in the house one day during that time, and my head pained and I laid down and felt drowsy, fell off in a sort of a sort of a daze, as it seemed to me, and when I came to I found I had fallen off on the floor, and my sisters and mother were standing around, and I went to work for Major Schaper for two weeks, - then worked for Henry Clay Ridgely, whose address I do not now know, - but who used to get his P.O. address in Rockdale, Balto. And worked for him about a year and three or four months, and about the latter part of 1866 or early part of 1867 I was driving H.C. Ridgely's team, loaded with lumber, hauling from James D. Ridgely's Mill, and had a fit come on and while in the saddle, and was
