

## DEPOSITION

Case of Jesse Fry (Survivor), No. 364,780

On this 9<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1888, at  
County of Jackson

State of Mississippi, before me, J. H. [unclear], a  
Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Jesse  
Fry, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer  
truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of afore-  
said pension claim, deposes and says:

I did not go to the doctor, and  
don't remember whether I had another  
in service. From Meridian  
we went to Yorktown where the  
regiment was, and from there  
I went to Yorktown, and from there  
I was sent to the Fortress Monroe  
hospital on account my wrist was  
I was carrying in a sling. It was at  
the time they got began moving  
towards Petersburg. At that hospital  
the doctor gave me medicine to pain  
my wrist with, and from there  
I was transferred to the "Summit  
House" hospital. There I was then  
treated for my arm and side, and  
water, the doctors operated on me  
and stuff in me, through pipes, into  
my bladder - I had no fits there,  
I never told me the doctor there  
that I had fits before I went in the  
Army. - I never said anything  
to the doctors there about my  
having fits.

After discharge I came right here  
to Saltwater, lived with my mother  
and father, remained with them
