

## DEPOSITION

Case of *Katie Frey*

On this 17 day of Dec, 1898, at Baltimore, county of \_\_\_\_\_, State of Maryland, before me, P. L. Cole, a special examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared

Katie Frey, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this special examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

I am 37 years of age; my post-office address is 1707 Preston St. Baltimore Md. I saw the widow of Jesse Frey who served in Co. I. 4. Md. Vol. Infy. My husband died Aug 23 or 24 1894. <sup>and</sup> I am now drawing a pension as his widow under the new law at the rate of \$800 per month and \$200 additional for one child Jesse who was born Feb 15, 1887. I was married to Jesse Frey under the name of Katie Broeyer on June 6, 1876. Neither of us were previously married <sup>and</sup> I have not remarried since his death.

I had my check sent to the home of Henry Lee <sup>in March 1898</sup> Lee 534. N. Exeter St. this City. I was not there to receive the check. Lee received it from me, and he handed it to me. <sup>No Sir</sup> I did not receive it from the letter carrier. I had my check for payment to Sept June 1898 sent to Lee's home but I did not get it there. I got it at the post office. The letter carrier would not leave it. In Sept. 1898 I had my check sent to my home 1616 Preston St. this City.

Q How are your pension certificates?

A Yes Sir. (Show the Special Examiner Pfc) I have always retained it. No Sir I have not pledged it as security for debt. I have never touched any money on it.

I understand your question <sup>and</sup> my answers are correctly recorded.
