

GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

Personally came before me, a Justice of the Peace in and for aforesaid County City
and State, Laura Cox, aged 34 years
and aged years
citizen of the City of Balto., County of State of
Post Office Address.

Maryland well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who,
being duly sworn, declare in relation to aforesaid case, as follows:

I saw Jesse Fry when he came home
on furlough from the Hospital in 1864. He
then had his left arm in a sling -
I have known him intimately since the
end of his enlistment in 1865. Having lived
a near neighbor to him on Sarah Ann St
in Baltimore - He removed to the County and
we lived on the same place from about 1866
until 1871. He was working for Mr Ridgely and
and other, when he was fit to work, and I was
nurse in Mr Ridgely's family. In 1871 I was mar-
ried and Fry boarded with my husband,
and was working at intervals wherever he could
make day labor, until 1876. He was married
about 1876, and we still lived neighbors in
the County, until about 1880. In 1880 I removed
to the City and Fry and his wife whenever they
came to the City, about once in two weeks or so,
stopped at my house. In 1884 Fry and his family
removed to the City and lived neighbors to me.
I saw him very frequently in every year since
his discharge to the present time, and I have seen
him in falling fits frequently in each and every
year since discharge. He can't get any steady
employment on account of these fits and is prevented
from hard labor on account of injury to his wrist. He
cannot work half the time.

I further declare that I have no interest in said case, and am not concerned in
its prosecution. I have known him to be ill in the house more than a week
at a time after his spasms - in each and every year since
