W well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declared in relation to aforesaid case as follows:

I saw that they were on a visit to Jesse Frey's house No 7 Clayton's Row in the latter part of May 1886 and Jesse Frey was in bed just recovering from a fit as they were informed by the family. We know that he is subject to fits and has had several during the year 1886. Josephine Rush has been to the house frequently when Frey was confined from effects of fits in the last six months. She never knew he had fits until about six months ago. Laura Cox is the sister of Jesse Frey is married and supported by her husband, and has no interest in Jesse Frey's claim. She swears she has often seen him fall in these spasms since June 1886. In June last he ~~stayed~~ after the fit at No 7 Clayton's Row he was longer recovering than usual and got back in his rent and ^{she} took him & wife with ^{her} to save expense. He has had two ^{bad} spells since June - and frequently he comes in with symptoms of spasms and is compelled to lie down or go to bed, and take medicine on account of this malady. He is not able to work scarcely at all recently, and his wife pays their house expenses by her labor. Josephine Rush swears that she has seen him in bed at Mrs Cox's house since June 86. Suffering with the same malady. he is always ^{after an attack} sick from two to five days ^{she is} in and out of Mrs Cox's house every day or two.
