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deposed as Cook by Mrs. Keldner on
Pestody Heights. I lived with Mrs. Keldner
off and on for sixteen years. she died
four years ago. Her son Mr. Albert Keldner
lives here in this City. and he knows my
husband. I had six children by
Mr. Mills. only two living. both men
and married. However my husband
was only sick a few weeks. he had an
abscess in his head. and he was crazy
when he died. Dr. Brown attended
my husband when he was sick. The Dr.
knew my husband from childhood.
After my husband died my son went
to the Dr. for a Certificate of death - or
as to how my husband died. and the
Doctor claimed that there was fifteen
dollars due for attendance. My son had
to go to the City Hall and there he was
given a circular to hand to Dr. Brown. and
after the doctor got the circular he made
out the Certificate. saying that my husband
was a widower. My son told him that
it was wrong. that I was living; but the
doctor said that my husband told him
that I had been dead for two years.
I was not able to go to the doctor. I
could not even go to see my husband
as my feet were in such shape I could
not get on a slipper.
