

In Service

Zachariah Butcher, & Enoch Ridgely, filed Feb'y 24, 1879, testify that they were members of the 19<sup>th</sup> U. S. C. T. and were present at Petersburg Va. July 30, 1864 and know that claimant was then & there wounded in right wrist. Ridgely "absent on duty service, Butcher present.

W<sup>m</sup> H. Roberts, Co B. 19<sup>th</sup> U.S.C.T. filed June 1, 1880 testifies that Claimant was wounded in the right wrist at Petersburg Va, July 30, 1864, was present & knows the fact from personal knowledge A. G. reports absent wounded since July 30, 1864

At discharge

left filed June 1-1880 - alleges inability to furnish medical evidence of existence of wound at discharge.

Isaiah Wheeler & Andrew Poulden, filed June 1-1880, testify that at the time of his discharge claimant was suffering from a wound of right wrist causing fingers of that hand to be very much drawn and almost useless, then, and up to the present time.
