Names of disabilities.

Disease of back, vertigo, rheumatism, enlarged prostate, general debility and senile debility.

Here give the claimant's statement (as briefly and as compactly as possible) in regard to the date of origin and cause of his disabilities and the manner in which they affect him.

He receives a pension of Ten dollars per month.
He makes the following statement in regard to the origin of his disabilities and date when first discovered by him: "Cannot work because of weakness of age."

Birthplace, Baltimore, Co., Md.; age, 71 years; height, 6-7; weight, 154 pounds; complexion, Brown; color of eyes, Dark; color of hair, Gray; occupation, Laborer; permanent marks and scars other than those described below, None

We hereby certify that upon examination we find the following objective conditions:

Pulse rate, 68, 74, 80; respiration, 18, 20, 30; temperature, 98

Here give a full description of the disabilities, in accordance with Book of instructions, and make a separate paragraph for each disability.

Back; Rheumatism: He has severe pain in the lumbar muscles in stooping and rising. He is unable to raise either arm quite to the vertical position, owing to pain in the shoulder joints. All muscles are sore upon manipulation.

He presents no symptoms of Vertigo.

Facts within the knowledge of the Board, or any member thereof, relative to the cause of any disability found should be stated.

Enlarged Prostate: He has no retention or incontinence of urine. No cystitis. No hypertrophy of the prostate gland. No stricture. Urine contains no abnormal matter. Urine light amber. S. G. 1020. Acid. No sugar or albumen.

General and Senile Debility: He is decrepid in his movements. His skin is wrinkled and loose. His muscles are soft and toneless. He is too feeble to work. He has no organic disease.

He has no disease of Lungs. Chest symmetrical; expiration 35, rest 36, inspiration 37.

Whenever a disability is shown or is believed to be due to or aggravated by vicious habits the opinion of the board must be stated. When not due to such habits this fact must be stated.

His Kidneys are in healthy condition.

No other disability found to exist.

He presents no evidences of syphilitic infection or other vicious habits.

We find that the aggregate permanent disability for earning a support by manual labor is due to Muscular Rheumatism and Senility, not due to vicious habits, and warrants a rating of \$12.00.

Heart is normal in position, size and function. He has no cyanosis, edema or dyspnoea.

When rates are recommended solely on subjective evidence the strongest reasons must be given therefor.
