D. 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment U. S. Col'd. vols. Commanded by Capt. Thomas M<sup>r</sup>. Carty, in the war of 1861; and that by reason of wounds received in the service aforesaid he has been granted a pension of eight dollars per month, in accordance with a certificate numbered 30.830. bearing date October 13<sup>th</sup> 1865.
