DEPOSITION "A"

Case of Amos Gibson, No. 536.135

On this fourth day of Aug., 1888, at
Baltimore, County of Ther. Smith, a
 State of md., before me, Martin
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Wright
 who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: I am about 50 yrs. of age;
 a laborer; and reside at 113 Arch Street
 Balto. Md. I was born near Mill Stone
 Landing, on Patuxent River, St. Marys
 County, Md. I was the slave of James
 Jarboe. When I enlisted I lived at
 Easton Md. and was owned by Miss
 Reno Jarboe. I enlisted in Balto. in
 Sept. 1863, in Co. "B" 7th U. S. C. T. and
 was discharged at Balto. Md. in fall
 of 1866. Capt. Webb, Lieut. White, Sergt.
 Whitney, & Corpl. Davis belonged to my
 Co. Amos Gibson was a Capt. I was
 a Pvt. I remember Amos Gibson
 very well, I did not know him
 before I enlisted. I don't think
 I have seen him since my discharge.
 If I did, it has slipped my memory.
 I cannot remember that Gibson was
 ever wounded or injured while in
 the Service, nor that he had any
 particular disease or disability.
 He might have been sick for a
 day or two with some common sick-
 ness, but I cannot specify the
 name or nature of any illness
 that he had, and I am not positive
 that he ever had anything the matter with him.
