 also had some trouble
 with his private, but I
 never saw his private,
 but I think he had to
 wear his private, bulged
 out, and in walking he
 would shift and carry
 his hand, used his fingers
 and acted like he was
 captured, now I never saw
 his private, as he captured
 but I think it was upon the
 left side.
 Now I cannot recall
 that there was anything
 wrong with either George
 or James Gibson in Iowa.
 I have not seen George
 Gibson since the war
 and Lem Gibson is dead.
 Now I have no knowledge
 of ever giving any testimony
 before an Examining Board
 Gibson's prison during and
 never lived at Eastern
 war, but there were two
 other Perry Johnsons in my
 Co. but I saw the only non-
 commissioned officer by
 my name in my company.
