In service I en-
listed in September 1863 and
was discharged in
November 1866.

I was appointed in
Co. B. 7th Regiment U.S. C.
Troops.

I am not positive that
I can recall the actual name
claimant as being in my Co.
but I remember we had a
cook by the name of
Leander Gibson, this
man was an old man
when he enlisted and
was always over drunk and
I do not think he ever did
any duty as a soldier or
a corporal.

I remember better with
this cook, and not to
my knowledge did I see
him with any man by
the name of Gibson in
