DEPOSITION G.Case of Horace Gibson, No. 536135

On this 11<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1888, at  
Unionville, County of Falbot  
 State of Wd, before me, Marion Smith, a  
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared

James Gibson, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer  
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of afore-  
 said pension claim, deposes and says: I am forty seven

years of age. - My P. O. is Easton,  
Falbot Co. Wd. - I am a day laborer.

I am drawing a pension from the  
government. - During the late war

I was a private in Co. C, 4<sup>th</sup> Regt.  
U. S. C. T. The claimant in this

case, Horace Gibson, who is a nephew  
of mine was a member of "Co. B"

of the "4<sup>th</sup> Regt. U. S. C. T." - we were  
slaves and were raised together and

I have known him all my life.

I was not present when he was  
injured, but in a day or two after-

wards I heard of it and went to  
see him. When I went into to see

him he was lying down and he  
showed me the injured parts which

were badly swollen. I told him  
that he was captured and asked

him how it had occurred. He said  
that he was carrying poles to

build stockades for the soldiers to  
live in and had fallen and hurt

himself. This injury was received  
in the winter of 1864, at Benedict

Charles Co. Md, and until I was  
discharged in 1865 in the month
