When Nelson went into the army he appeared all right but when we were near Dutton Gap and Fort Hannon on the James River in the Winter of 1864 Nelson got a cold and it seemed to settle on his lungs and he had a bad cough from that time on but he kept with the band.

After Nelson came from the army he didn't do much of any thing when he was around here as I remember he had a bad cough and looked weak like.

I know that Daniel Coon and Mary E. Coon were always called man and wife and I know that Nelson was her son or called so anyway. I was owned on the plantation that joined Dr. Silas Harris and was a fine one then.
