DEPOSITION *H*Case of *May E. Coon*, No. *342940*

On this *7* day of *June*, 1887, at
Haguetown, County of *Washington*
 State of *Maryland*, before me, *Thomas House*, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared *Perry*
Moffey, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of afore-
 said pension claim, deposes and says: I am about 57 I was

born June 24th 1830 my residence is *Haguetown*, and which is my post office address

I am a general labourer I was a
 slave and owned by Mr Isaac *Cum*
ter who died some years ago

I became acquainted with Mr
 and Mrs *Coon*, when I was about
 sixteen years old they lived on
 Mr *Filgumans* plantation, she was
 a slave but her husband was not

They had some children, when
 they were on *Filgumans* place and
 some of the they went to live in
Haguetown

I dont remember just when
Daniel Coon died but it was be-
 fore the war he was a blacksmith
 and got hurt in his stomach
 which caused his death

I enlisted in August the 28th 1863 in
 the 1st *Bugala* Band U. S. C. I. I was
 enlisted at the same time he
 was about 19 years when he enlisted
 to the best of my judgment he
 was a good healthy looking boy
 then and I never knew of him
 being sick up to that time
