DEPOSITION ACase of Louisa A Henry, No. 615.878

On this 12 day of January, 1898, at
Wagenerstown, County of Washington
 State of MS, before me, W B Clapp, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Perry Moxley
Coit, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: around his body.

Q Did he wear a pad under any part
 of the bandage?

A I never noticed particularly whether
 he did or not. If he did I cannot
 recollect it.

Q What was the condition of his privates
 or testicles at that time?

A I have no recollection that anything ailed
 them. I do not recollect that his testicles
 were swollen. I am quite confident
 if they had been I would have noticed
 it.

Q Then, the only disability or injury he had
 was, as far as you knew, located in
 his groin and was a lump, or rupture?

A Yes sir. I know of no other.

Q Are you sure you saw the rupture,
 and the naked groin where he was
 injured?

A Yes I am sure.

Q How did you come to state to the
 Special Examiner, and in your affi-
 davit made in this case that you
 never saw the naked parts, or the
 rupture?

A I have no recollection now of
 making any such statement now,
