 first wife under sixteen years of age at the  
 time of his death. I never had any child  
 or children by soldier. Soldier and I lived  
 together from our marriage to soldier's  
 death we never were divorced. I can  
 prove this by Frank and Alice Brooks of Hager-  
 stown Md. and by my father Alexander Banks  
 of this city. I have not remarried since  
 soldier's death. nor lived with any man  
 as his wife. I have heard soldier say  
 that he incurred his hernia of right-side  
 while in the army, I do not recollect as to  
 when or where it occurred. He said that  
 he slipped and fell some thing give way  
 and that he remarked to Perry and Robert  
 Moxley that he was captured. I do not  
 recollect of hearing him say whether he was  
 treated for his capture while in the service.  
 I do not recollect whether he said that
