

### Declaration for Widow's Pension.

(Act of June 27, 1890.)

To be executed before a Clerk of a Court of Record or a Notary Public or Justice of the Peace *having a Seal.*

State of Maryland, County of Washington, SS.

On this 30<sup>th</sup> day of July, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety one, personally appeared before me, W. Circuit Court in and for the aforesaid County, duly authorized to administer oaths, Mary E.

Moxley, aged 50 years, a resident of the town of Stagerstown, county of Washington

State of Maryland, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of Joseph Moxley, who, enlisted under the name

of Joseph Moxley at Stagerstown Md, on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of September, 1863, in The Band of the First Brigade United States Colored Troops as a 2nd Class mus. (Her state rank, company and regiment in military service, or vessel, if in the navy.)

in the war of the Rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was honorably discharged at Brownsville, Texas, and died September 1<sup>st</sup> 1864 (The cause of death need not be stated.)

That she was married under the name of Mary Quinn, to said Joseph Moxley on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of September, 1853, by Rev Savage Hammond, at Stagerstown Md

there being no legal barrier to said marriage (If there was a former marriage of claimant or her husband, state it here and how dissolved.)

That she has not remarried since the death of the said Joseph Moxley (Name of soldier or sailor.)

That she is without other means of support than her daily labor. That names and dates of birth of all the children of the soldier now living under sixteen years of age are as follows:

That she has heretofore applied for pension and the number of her former application is 368,984. (Be careful to fill this part of the blank correctly.)

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890. She hereby appoints
