DEPOSITION GCase of Mary E. Morley, No. 368.984

On this eighteenth day of September, 1889, at
Hagerstown, County of Washington
 State of Md, before me, Wm. Hughes, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Joseph W.
Bole, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: My age is 58 years, occupation,
a laborer, and P.O. address No 23 West Church St.

Hagerstown, Md

I knew the late Joseph Morley Morley many a day
 before he was in the army and before he was
 married, but I knew him long before she
 was married.

I also worked with the deceased soldier both
 before and after he was in the army and was
 with him when he enlisted and a camp aimed
 him as far as Baltimore.

I enlisted when he enlisted, but in a different
 organization, Co. G, 2d U.S. C. I. - and never
 saw him after we separated at Baltimore, while in
 service.

I was home from the army before Joseph Morley
 came home and saw him when he first returned
 and was always very intimate with him, afterward.

Before service I know that he had good
 health, and was a good hand to labor, because
 I worked with him, but he looked spare and thin
 when he came home from the army, and
 did not seem as good a worker as before.

He complained of pain in his left side
 and of headache and his gums were black
 looking and he told me that he had had
 the scurvy when he was in Texas, while in
 service.
