

Page 8 He complained, especially during the last 2 weeks of his life, of his head and mouth and stomach. He always said that the scurvy had gone through his system and that he would never get well of it. He had no sores anywhere on his person, only on his mouth and his mouth was always sore after his return from the army.

He never had a doctor come to see him during his life time, but he used to take medicine more or less all the time and used a wash on his mouth.

I do not know from whom he got the medicine nor whether by the advice of a physician or not.

I can not describe the symptoms of his last sickness more particularly than that he complained of the scurvy going all through him and affecting his mouth, head and stomach especially.

Comrades of my husband during some of his service I know are his brothers, Perry Moxley, Thomas Henry and James Hill all of whom reside in Huguenot.

I have told you all I can about the physical condition of my husband after service and prior to the time of his death, except that he was troubled with something like diarrhoea during the last 6 years of his life.

I have heard this statement read and my answer to the questions asked me are correctly recorded in it.

I know my rights and privileges during this examination of my claim for pension, but do not come to be present at it.
