DEPOSITION *J*Case of *Mary E. Moxley*, No. 368.984

On this *seventeenth* day of *September*, 188*9*, at
No 39 West Church St. Hagerstown, County of *Washington*
 State of *Md*, before me, *Wm. Hughes*, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared *Perry*
Moxley, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: My age is *59* years, occupation
a laborer and P.O. address as given above

I am a brother of the late *Joseph Moxley*, was
 about *8* years older than he was, served along
 with him in the *1st Brigade Band U.S.C.* and
 had knowledge of him during his whole life period.

I also knew *Carriable* before she was married
 to my brother. I know that neither had been previously
 married, and know that she has remained his widow
 since he died but do not remember the date of his
 death nor the date of birth of any of his children.

My brother's health was always good from a child up
 and until about *9* or *10* months after his enlistment
 and at date of enlistment we were all required to
 pass a medical examination in a *new* *State*

About *9* or *10* months after enlistment he com-
 plained of pain in his left side, after we had passed
 the *Rappa* hammer test, just after the battle
 of the *Wilderness* in *1862* and he always con-
 tinued to complain of that pain afterwards during
 service and afterwards until he died.

But he always continued on duty while in service
 and I do not know that he ever attended sick call
 but he sometimes went to the doctors and got
 medicine when we were encamped near *Brown-*
ville Texas in the summer of *1865*.

While in Texas he took the scurvy and
