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A. I made a written agreement with my attorney for a fee of \$25⁰⁰ provided I should get a pension

Q. State the amount of fees paid by you or at your instance, to whom paid, and all the circumstances connected with the transaction.

A. I sent one (\$1.00) dollar in cash to my attorney. He said he required "stamps" and I sent a one dollar bill in a letter, but got no receipt for it.

Q. Please give me the names of all witnesses that you desire examined elsewhere, with their post-office addresses, and also state what you expect to prove by each witness.

A. I have no more witnesses

Q. Have you heard me read over all the testimony written during this investigation of your claim for pension?

A. I have been present in person during the examination of all of the witnesses except two, Mrs Logan and Alice J. Brooks and I have heard you read over the testimony of both as well as that of all the other witnesses seen and questioned.

Q. Have you any complaint to make as to the conduct, manner, or fairness of the examination of your claim? If so, please state specifically what it is.

A. I have no complaint to make

Q. Do you desire to introduce any more testimony before me?

A. I do not.
