

WIDOW'S CLAIM FOR PENSION.

ON THIS 18th day of September, 1890, personally appeared before me, a
..... of a Court of Record in and for the County and State aforesaid, Mary E. Mosley
Mosley a resident of Washington in the County of
Washington and State of Maryland aged 48 years, who being
duly sworn, makes the following declaration, in order to obtain the Pension provided by the Act of Congress approved
July 14, 1862. That she is the widow of Joseph Mosley who was
a Private in Company 1st commanded by U. S. J. J.
in the 9th Regiment of U. S. J. J. in the War of 1861; that
her maiden name was Mary E. Quinn and that she was married
to said Joseph Mosley on or about the 20th day of September
1862, at Washington in the County of Washington
and State of Maryland by Rev. Sarge. Hammond
that she knows of no record evidence of said marriage. She not having any marriage
certificate - but can furnish evidence of same

SHE FURTHER DECLARES that said Joseph Mosley her
husband, died at Washington in the State of
Maryland, on or about the 1st day of September, 1880
of Heart Disease & having been
a sufferer from Heart Disease since
the year 1870. She also declares that she has remained a widow ever since the death of
said Joseph Mosley and that she has not in any manner been engaged
in, or aided or abetted, the rebellion in the United States; and she hereby appoints William
Fitch of Washington as her lawful Attorney, with
power of substitution, and authorizes them to present and prosecute this claim. The following are the
name, date of birth, and place of residence of all the children of her deceased husband who were under
sixteen years of age at the time of his death Joseph - aged 12 yrs

Melchor aged 11 yrs. Mary Eliza aged 9 yrs.
Robert Oscar aged 7 yrs. Alfred William aged 4 yrs.
