month of October, 1883, on Walnut Street, Stager-
stown, Maryland, under the following cir-
cumstances: I was driving a hack along the
track of the Cumberland Valley railroad located
on the above named street when my horses
became frightened at an approaching train.
The horses jumped and hack was turned sud-
denly around. I was thrown from my seat
violently to the ground striking the railroad
rail with my right ankle—the latter being
broken by the fall
