Declaration for the Increase of an Invalid Pension.

(UNDER ANY LAW.)

State of Maryland County of Washington ss:ON THE DATE HEREINAFTER MENTIONED, personally appeared before me, a Notary Publicwithin and for the County and State aforesaid Perry Moxleyaged 69 years, a resident of Hagerstown County of Washington Stateof Maryland who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is a pensioner of theUnited States, under Law of 1890 enrolled at the Washington Pension Agency atthe rate of \$ 8 - Dollars per month, Certificate No. 931458 by reason ofNo further use, & by reason of letter from War DepartmentThat he served as a Private 1st Regt. Band U. S. Colored TroopsThat he believes himself to be entitled to an increase of pension on account of too low rating forhis present degree of disability as above.

That he is also materially disabled for manual labor by the following additional disabilities on

which he also claims pension total disability, being confined to bed & room for the last 15 monthsby reason of Bright's disease and disease of heart & lungs.

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and

belief permanent. He hereby appoints, with full power of substitution, MILO B. STEVENS& CO., of WASHINGTON, D. C. their successors and legal representatives, his true

and lawful attorneys, to present and prosecute his claim, requesting that, in the event of the

allowance of the same, his said attorneys be paid the fee now provided by law.
