

carrying passengers to and from the Fair Grounds, - at the Exhibition in 1884 - I drove from Franklin Street towards Washington, along the track of the C. & O. R.R. and encountered an incoming train; the horses took fright, - wheeled about around, - the left side of the hack caught on a post, and threw me from the seat. One of the hind wheels struck my ankle - I was carried down to my house, - and Dr. N. D. Scott was sent for. His son J. M. Thomson Scott came with his father a couple of times while I was under treatment - My ankle was put in splints and bandaged, and I was laid up for some months - I think the accident occurred Oct. 18, 1884, and I didn't get out of the house till the next Spring, - I believe I came down to the Court House on crutches in Feb. following. Mr. Krebs brought a suit against the R. R. Company for the damage to his hack, - and I was summoned as a witness - I am still lame from this injury, and am suffering from cataract and rheumatism.

None of my disabilities are due to vicious habits. I am now 65 years of age - approaching 66.
