NOTES.
 The Physician's Affidavit must show the following facts:
 1st. A complete diagnosis of the disabilities upon which the claim for pension is based, and the period during which he treated him.
 2d. That the soldier is suffering at present from a mental or physical disability of a permanent character not the result of his own vicious habits which incapacitates him from the performance of manual labor in such a degree as to render him unable to earn a support. The degree or extent he has been disabled since the filing of his application should be plainly stated.

His ailments are such as to incapacitate him for manual labor and render him unable to earn a living.

Chronic Rheumatism, involving both legs and feet, indolent, vision, dyspepsia and catarrh.

That he is a Practicing Physician, and that he has been acquainted with said soldier for about 1 years, and that well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declares in relation to aforesaid case as follows:

*Personally came before me, a Justice of the Peace, in and for the aforesaid County and State of *California*, a citizen of *California*, whose Post Office address is *422 Glenview St. Los Angeles, California*.*

All the facts in possession of affiant as to the origin and continuance of the disability should be fully set forth, and the dates of treatment should be specifically given.
