The name of organizations in which you served? Answer. *7th Maryland Regiment*

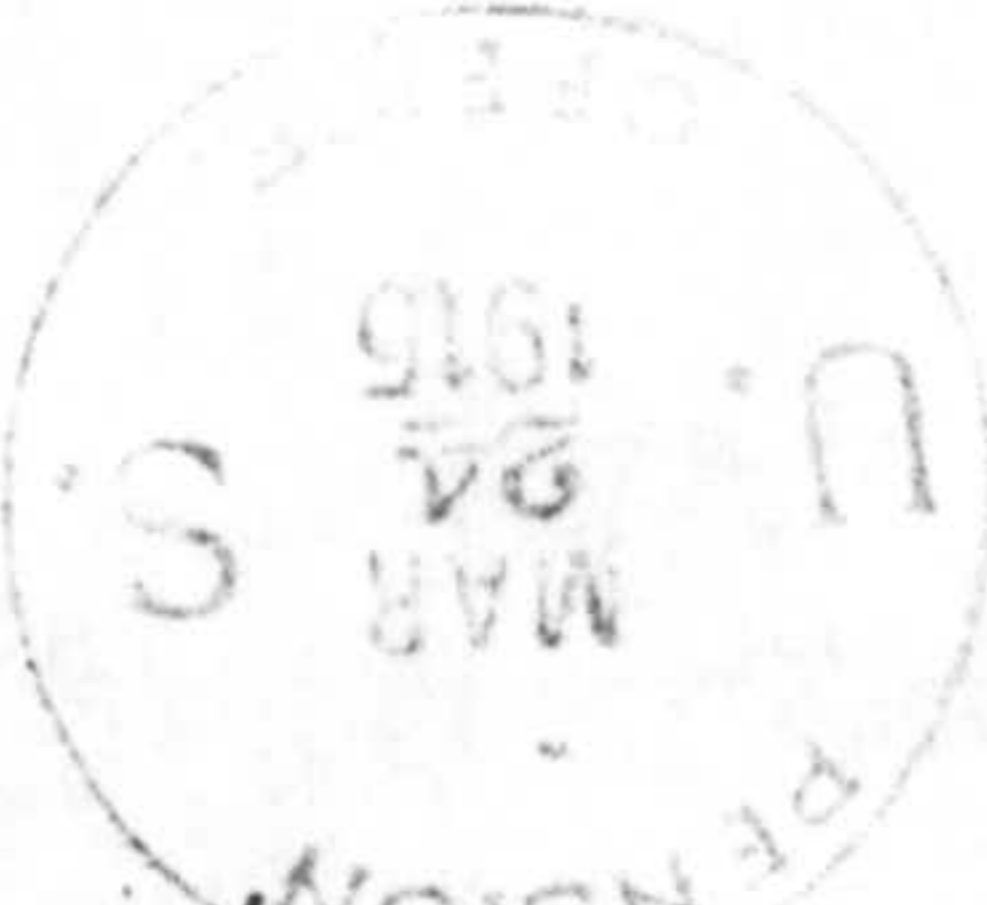
