Madam:

In your claim for reimbursement in the case of Edward alias George H. Tasker, late pensioner, Inv. Ctf. No. 29,751 (Navy), you are required to furnish:

(1) Itemized bills from the doctor, druggist and undertaker for services rendered or supplies furnished pensioner during his last sickness and burial. Each bill should contain pensioner's name and should show, over creditor's signature, by whom paid; or if unpaid, that you are held responsible for payment.

(2) Your own statement showing what charge per day or week you make for nursing pensioner in his last illness.

(3) A statement from the officer having custody of the records showing the assessed and the actual value of the real estate (small house) left by pensioner, and the amount of indebtedness recorded against it at time of pensioner's death.

(4) Your own statement as to the date of death of pensioner's wife, Adeline, and as to whether pensioner was married more than once. This latter requirement is necessary because while you, his daughter, give your age as thirty-seven, pensioner claimed to have married Adeline, May 2, 1895. If there was a prior marriage, is the first wife dead or divorced?
