Sir:

In reply to your letter of July 29, 1882, I have to state that the discharge certificate of George, or George W. Miller, Co. D 30 U. S. C. T. is not on file in this Office. There is however a discharge certificate of George H. Miller, of said Co. and Regt. on file with a claim for bounty, which was filed Dec. 16, 1874, by Belva A. Lockwood, as attorney, and disallowed May 10, 1875, for the reason that all pay and bounty had been formerly paid the soldier. The witnesses in the application, to the claimant's identity were Henry Miller, and W. B. Tuck of Annapolis Maryland. If you are satisfied said discharge certificate refers to the soldier for whom you write, it will be forwarded to you, on the receipt of your certificate to that effect, with the return of this letter.
