Sir:

Referring to the claim under the Act of March 3, 1899

of Hannah Scott for one-half the pension allowed Perry W.

Scott, Co. K, 4 U. S. C. Vol. Inf., Ctf. No. 539389, you are

advised that the pensioner has filed his own sworn statement

alleging that he did not desert the claimant; that she drove

him away from home and has refused to allow him to live with

her although he has made overtures to her for a reconciliation;

that while he lived with her he was a good faithful husband

and tried to give her a comfortable living; and that she cannot

get a single person to truthfully say that he was ever abusive

to her.

The claimant should file her own sworn statement in answer to each and all of the above allegations and any statement that she may make should be corroborated as fully as possible by the testimony of two or more credible witnesses who have personal knowledge of the facts to which they testify.
