DECLARATION FOR PENSION.

THE PENSION CERTIFICATE SHOULD NOT BE FORWARDED WITH THE APPLICATION.

On this 28 day of March, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and Seven, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the county and State aforesaid, John Blackwell, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is 62 years of age, and a resident of Junis Mills county of Talbot, State of Maryland; and that he is the identical person who was ENROLLED at Baltimore under the name of John Blackwell, on the 23 day of September, 1863, as a Private, in Company B. T. Regt. U. S. Col. Troops

in the service of the United States, in the Civil war, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at Indenola Texas, on the 13 day of October, 1866.

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provisions of the act of February 6, 1907.

That his post-office address is Easton R. F. D., county of Talbot, State of Maryland.
