

Declaration for Increase of Pension.

Under the Acts of June 27, 1890, and May 9, 1900. Amended by Order No. 78 of April 13, 1904.

To be executed before some officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. The official character and signature of any such officer not required by law to use a seal must be certified by the clerk of the proper court, giving dates of beginning and close of official term. If certificate is on file, so state.

On this 21 day of Dec, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and Five personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the county and State aforesaid John Blackwell, aged 65 years, late a member of Co. B 7 Regiment, Ind. Vols. a resident of the Town of Junie Mills, County of Talbot State of Ind., who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is a pensioner of the United States under the Act of June 27, 1890, enrolled at the Washington Pension Agency, at the rate of 6 dollars per month, by reason of partial inability to earn a support by manual labor, his Pension Certificate be numbered 107127

That he believes himself to be entitled to an increase of pension on account of the DISABILITIES HERETOFORE ALLEGED, namely: rheumatism and dyspepsia
