

Act of June 27, 1890.

DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION.

To be executed before a Court of Record or some officer thereof having custody of its seal, a Notary Public, or Justice of the Peace, whose official signature shall be verified by his official seal, and in case he has none, his signature and official character shall be certified by a Clerk of a Court of Record, or a City or County Clerk.

State of Maryland, County of Talbot, ss:

On this 18th day of September, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety-8^{up}

, personally appeared before me, George E. S. Lovelace
a Notary Public within and for the County and State aforesaid,

John Blackwell, aged 54 years, a resident of the Town
of Sumis Mills County of Talbot,

State of Maryland, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is

the identical John Blackwell, who was ENROLLED on the 23rd

day of September, 1863 in Co. "B" 7th. Regiment U.S.
(Here state rank, company, and regiment in Military service, or vessel, if in the Navy.)

Colored Troops in the service of the

United States in the war of the rebellion, and served at least ninety days, and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at

Indianola, Texas, on the 13th day of October, 1866.

That he has not been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated

above No other service whatsoever in the army or Navy.
(Here state what the service was, whether prior or subsequent to that stated above, and the dates at which it began and ended.)

That he is wholly unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of Rupture
(Here name the disease or

Chronic rheumatism, weak eyes.
injuries from which disabled.)

and resulting general debility. That said disabilities are not due to his

vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent. That he has hitherto

applied for pension under application No. That he is a pensioner under Certificate No

but claim was refused disallowed.
(If a pensioner, the Certificate number only need be given. If not, give the number of the former application, if one was made.)

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States, under the provisions of the act of June 27, 1890.

He hereby appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation,

J. Thomas Sumner of Washington, D. C.

his true and lawful attorney to prosecute his claim, the fee to be TEN DOLLARS as prescribed by law. That
