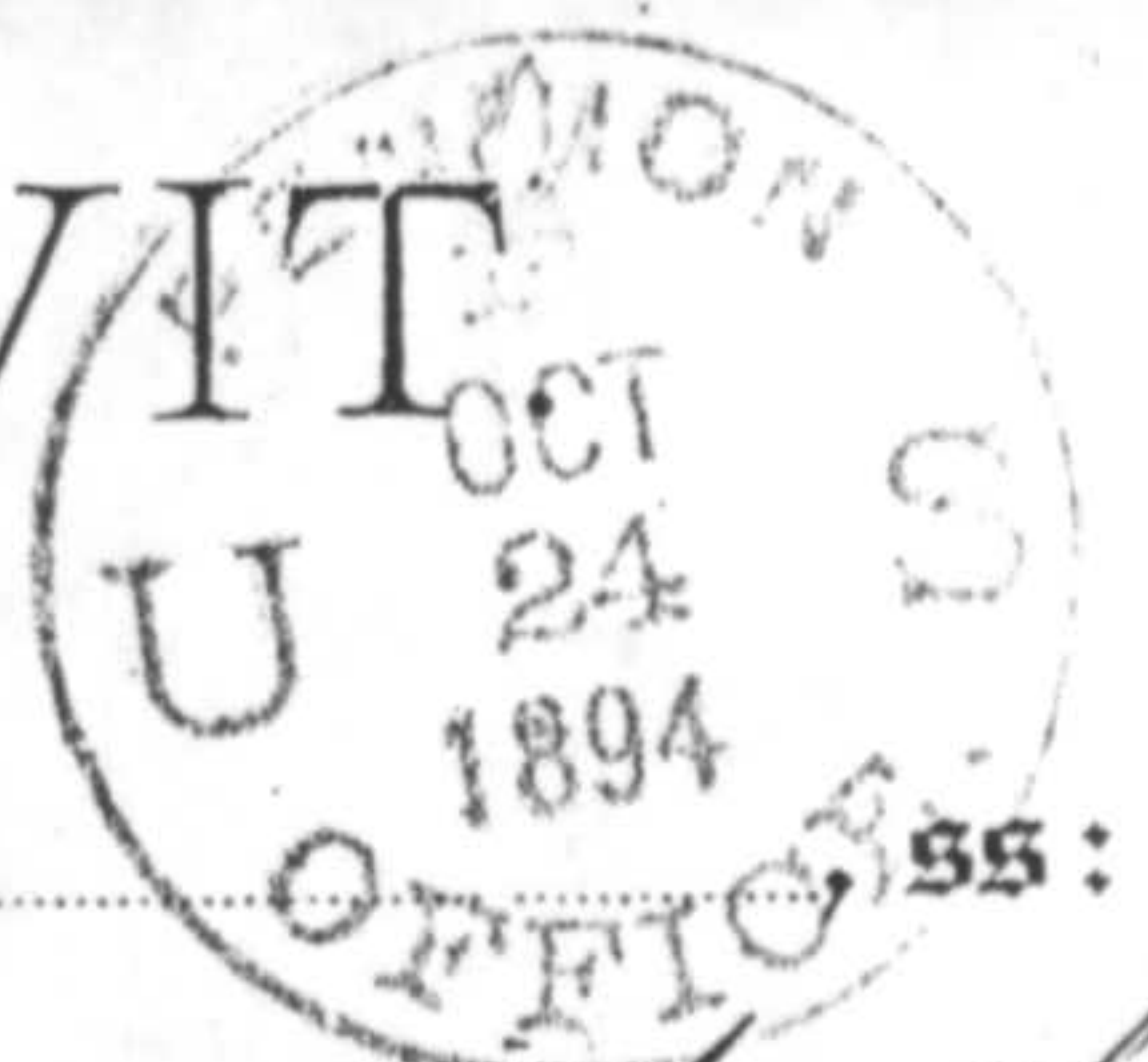


GENERAL AFFIDAVIT
