*I was injured in my ankle
at what was known as Powder Horn, Tex.,
on the wharf in unloading a vessel by
a barrel rolling on it (which I stated in a
former affidavit.) I did not seem to be
much hurt at first and kept around,
although I was quite lame & it pained me
a good deal. I finally was sent to the field
hospital for treatment, where I remained
a few days, and returned to the company
and resumed light duty.*

nesses, as a good many of them are dead,
others are scattered around so I cannot
find them, whilst a few perhaps, who
ought to know do not remember as they
will 30 years ago.*
