TESTIMONY OF PHYSICIAN.

The physician should carefully examine applicant, and describe his present physical condition, as same is affected by any disability. The affidavit should, if possible be in the handwriting of the affiant. All physical signs of disease or injury should be examined and diagnosed.

Furthermore he saith, that he has made a careful examination of the body of the said Edward

Dorham and from such examination he finds, and now says that his condition, as
affected by disease or injury, is as follows: Chronic Bronchitis;

Chronic Rheumatism in left foot & knee.

disabilities by technical medical terms.]

He further states, that to the best of his knowledge and belief, said disabilities do not result from claimant's own vicious habits, and that said disabilities are of a permanent character, and incapacitate him from the performance of manual labor in such a degree as to render him unable to earn a support.

He further declares that he has no interest either direct or indirect, in the prosecution of this claim.
