Md. I was a member of Co. C. 7 U.S.C. and knew Edward
Dorham of the same regiment. I am not certain about his Company
whether it was D or E. Yes it might be Co. A. I do not
remember any sickness he had while in the army, but I know
that about a year or a year and a half after he came
out I remember his complaining of scurvy and some
other disease. He complained of misery, inwardly ^{and}
looked bad, weak, and could not stand hard work
at all, was always complaining like. No, I do not
remember any particular appearance about his skin. Yes,
I do remember that he was broken out on the face once
a long time ago with some spotted kind of disease. No,
I don't think he was wounded, nor was he ever hurt
to my recollection. Yes I have noticed something peculiar
about his walking. I think he is lame in his right side
I think it is in his arm and leg too. No, I could
not say whether his arm or leg was ever hurt.
Yes, I have heard him mention of misery in his ankle,
but not say which ankle. I don't know what caused it.
I suppose it's been over two years ago I first heard
him mention it. He has been paralysed now going on
a year but I don't know what caused it. I don't know
of anything else that ails him.

When I testified I went with Dorham and a
yellow man to an office on St Paul street. an old
gentleman made out the papers and swore me
and the other man. The paper was read to me

Since you have read that paper, I remember
to have heard him complain in the army and since
with his left ankle, but it was only of late that
his complaint was serious.

This deposition has been read to me and I
