DEPOSITION

Case of Edward Durham, No. 753843

On this 14th day of May, 1895, at
 Baltimore, County of
 State of Maryland, before me, J. H. Brooks, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Edmund
 Burke, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: My age is 56 years

Enlisted in 1863 (October), Company
 H, 7th Regt U.S.C.V., and was discharged
 in October 1866.

I did not know Durham prior to my
 enlistment. I don't know anything
 at all about him being sick
 wounded or disabled while we
 were in the Army, as he was in
 another company. But we were
 together a good deal. No sir I
 do not know anything about
 him being injured in the Army.
 After discharge I have seen him
 several times each year but never
 worked or associated with him
 except at the Logan Post & A.R., which
 I joined about two years ago. He
 has frequently complained to me
 of having rheumatism. But I never
 visited him and if he told me
 when it affected him, I have
 forgotten it.
