Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your request of Aug. 2nd, 1881, for certain information for use in the consideration of application for Pension No. 349,127 and to return it herewith, with the following information from the records of this office:

It appears from the Rolls of U. S. Colored Troops on file in this office that Joseph Cole was enrolled on the 9th day of September, 1863, at Baltimore, Md., in Co. F, 2nd Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops, to serve three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a private on the 9th day of September, 1863, at Arlington, Va., in Co. F, 2nd Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. F of that Regiment, for the months of from origin to December 31st, 1865, he is reported present for duty.

He was mustered out of service with Company at Key West, Fla., January 5th 1866.

No evidence of the alleged injury in the records on file in this office.
