Your inquiry of July 6th, 1883, in Pension Claim No. 486,889, is herewith returned, with the following information:

Osborne Duckett was enrolled on the 21st day of February, 1864, at Washington Co. Md., as a Private in Co. "D." 30th Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops, to serve 3 years. He is reported on Muster Roll from origin to Dec. 31, 64 present for duty; Jan. & Feb. and Mar. & Apr. 65 absent, Sick in Genl. Hospl. since Feb. 65; May & June, "Mustered out May 24, 65*"; He was mustered out of service May 24, 1865 at Philadelphia, Pa. under orders of War Dept. of May 3, 65 - a patient in hospital. Company Returns for Feb. 1865 and to Apr. 65 report him absent sick in Hospl.; May 65 absent sick at Summit House Hospl. Company morning reports incomplete. Hospital records not on file. The alleged injury is not of record in this office.
