Sir:

The above-named applicant has been directed to report to you for examination on account of the disability or disabilities mentioned hereon. If other causes of disability are found on examination, they should be described. Evidences of the results of vicious habits should be sought in every case and reported on.

He is pensioned under the general law at \$17 for disability due to rheumatism and resulting disease of heart, and the question to be determined now is whether or not he is totally disabled for the performance of manual labor by reason of these disabilities alone.

In order that we may be in a position to estimate the degree of disability due to rheumatism and resulting disease of heart, alone, it is essential that you shall describe carefully not only these disabilities, but fully describe each and every disability from which this claimant is suffering, so that all the factors entering into the inability to perform manual labor may be known.

State condition of arteries, lungs, rectum, nervous system, prostate and kidneys (analysis of urine).
