DEPOSITION

Case of Joseph Gale, No. 150030

On this 25 day of October, 1886, at
Easton, County of Talbot
 State of MD, before me, Rodney Chipp, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Joseph E
M. Chamberlain, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of afore-
 said pension claim, deposes and says: that his name is Joseph

E. M. Chamberlain, age 60. Physician.
Easton, Talbot Co. MD. graduated
 at the Med University of Md. and has
 practiced 35 years. that he has not
refused to make an affidavit in this
case but may have refused to make an
affidavit such as was asked of him,
that is they may have wanted him to
connect the death cause with his army
service which he could not do.

That the immediate cause of
death was congestion of the brain,
that he was unconscious when witness
was called and did not regain
consciousness, that his people told
witness at the time that his brain
had been affected for some time
but he does not recollect as to their
telling him how, when, or where
it was first affected.

That he finds on his books that
he attended soldier March 12, 1864,
and that he died within a day or
two of that date.
