24 day of Sept-1863 as a Private
in Company 13th Commanded by Capt
Hall in the 7th U.S.C.T. (State of Maryland)
Volunteers, - Infantry, - in the war
of 1861 and was honorably discharged
out, on the 20 day of October 1864, That
while in the service aforesaid, and in the
line of duty in or about the ~~the~~ 12 of March
18 in the year A.D. 1864 he received the
following Sprain, and the account of
