That they knew James Wilson the soldier from boyhood and know that he had never been married before his marriage to Annie Moore (claimant) They became acquainted with claimant after her marriage to said soldier May 6, 1880, and have known her ever since and soldier up to his death Dec 5, 1918. and from such long and intimate acquaintance we know that they lived together as husband and wife from date of marriage up to soldier's death, were never divorced, and that claimant has not remarried since his death.

NOTE.—Affiants should state how they gained a knowledge of the facts to which they testify.

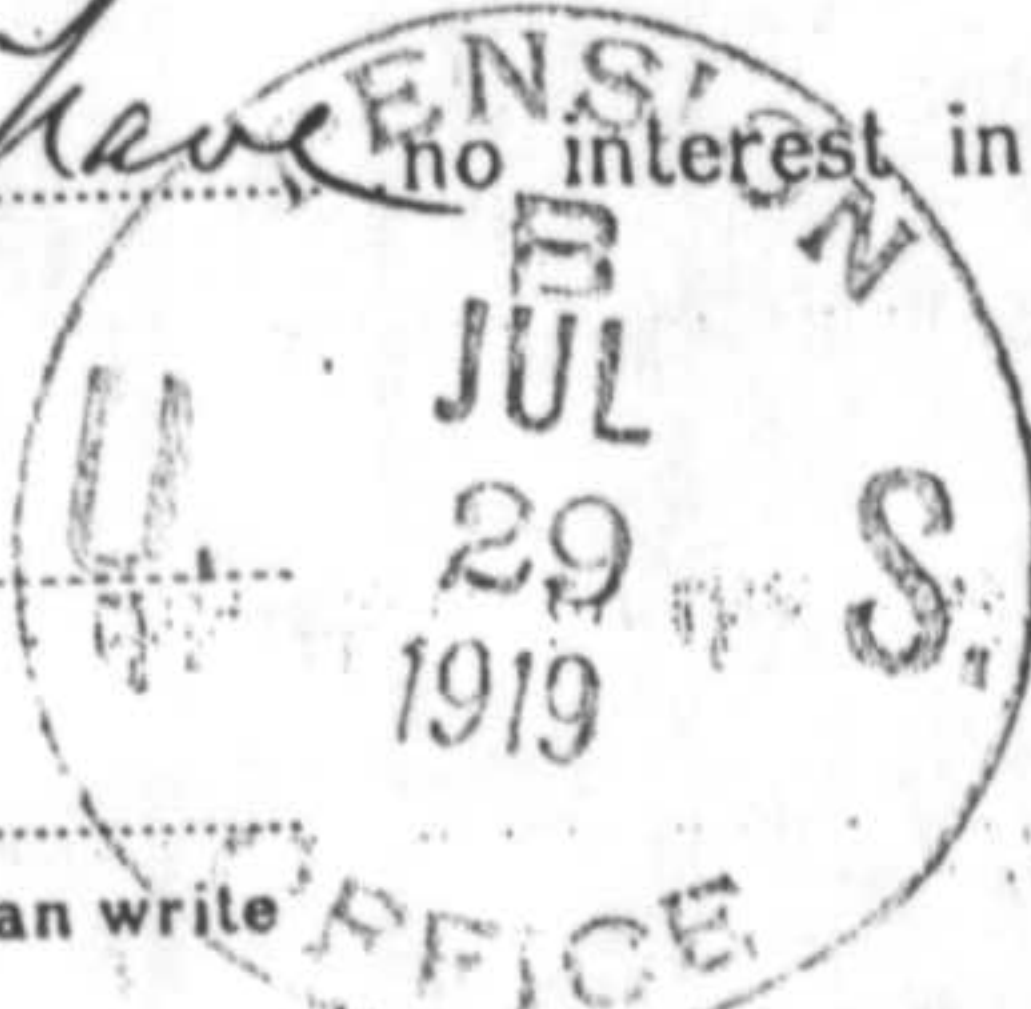
We know that James Wilson was married to Agnes Mason before he married Annie Moore but left him some time before his last marriage and we don't know what has become of her.
