On this 25 day of June , 1921, at Baltimore county of Baltimore City , State of Maryland before me, W.H.Stovall , a Special Examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared Mary J.Gray , who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this special examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

1 I am 53 years old, occupation laundress, and post
2 office address 644 Eislens st, Baltimore Md. I am
3 unmarried. I have known Agnes Mason all my life as
4 we are about second cousins and I used to live in
5 the same house in Washington City many years ago
6 that her father lived in and we both came originally
7 from Calvert county Md. I have lived in this city
8 about thirty one years, and I lived in Washington for
9 several years or rather from the time I was no more
10 than a school girl. I see Agnes often as we have al-
11 ways been good friends. I know her sister in Chicago
12 and her brother John Mason who is in Philadelphia.
13 Agnes Mason is the maiden name of this woman and I rec-
14 ollect hearing her father Israel Mason say one day in
15 Washington that cousin Agnes was going to get married
16 to a man named Wilson but I did not see the marriage
17 performed and never went to their house while they lived
18 together and in fact I never saw Mr Wilson. I do not
19 know how long they lived together but I know there was
20 a separation betwixt them and the cause of the trouble
21 I do not know but will say this: cousin Agnes is an up-
22 right woman and works hard to make her living. She has
23 not married any man since her separation from that Mr
24 Wilson that I could see or hear of. She has generally
25 gone by the name of Agnes Mason instead of Agnes Wilson
26 and I have never called her by any other name. I know
27 her children Mary and Georgie but I have never heard as
