9 no woman in the world. I recollect him slightly.

10 Q. How many children did Agnes Wilson have by Murray?

11 A. Two children and that is myself and sister Georgianna.

12 Q. Georgianna swears that she is 32 years old so there.
13 must have been some children between you and Georgianna.

14 I exhort you to tell the truth in this matter?

15 A. It was like this, James Murray went away after Geor-
16 gianna was born to do contract jobs and returned to mamma
17 as her gentleman friend and the next thing you know I was
18 born and soon after that he left mother for good.

19 Q. How long did Murray live with your mother?

20 A. I cant tell you that. He was at her house in Henri-
21 etta street as a boarder two or three different times.
