

Case of Agnes Wilson

7 and he went off and left mother when I was a child and
8 died in Philadelphia or somewhere.

9 Q. Was your mother married to James Murray?

10 A. No sir she was not. She had two children by him
11 and that is my sister Mary Felix and I.

12 Q. How long did your mother live with your father?

13 A. I dont know. He boarded with mother and helped
14 her get along, this was in Henrietta street. I was about
15 ten years old when Murray left mother and I know that he
16 has not lived with her or boarded with her since. I do
17 not know whether he was with her all the time from my
18 birth until I was ten years old, he was not boarding with
19 her all the time but would come and go. Mother never
20 had the flue when it was raging and cant hear real good
21 but her mind is all right. "Never" erased in line 19.

22 Q. Did James Murray live with your mother like a hus-

23 band when at her house? A. I suppose he did. She used
24 to be called Mrs Murray but now she is called Mrs Mason
25 and also Mrs Wilson and has had no other names.

26 Q. What other men has your mother lived with?
