In the above cited claim for pension you are advised that claimant has stated that she was married to the soldier May 6, 1880, under the name of Annie Moore, at Baltimore, Maryland, by the Rev. Robt. Steele; whereas she has furnished a certified copy of the marriage record of one Agnes Mason, widow, to one James Wilson, on May 6, 1880, at Baltimore, Maryland, by the Rev. Robt. Steele.

OK

There is required claimant's sworn statement, corroborated by that of two witnesses who knew her from the time she attained a marriageable age, showing whether she had been married prior to her marriage to the soldier; and if so, how and when such other marriage or marriages terminated, and the name of each former husband.

No affidavit can be considered satisfactory that fails to state the age and postoffice address of the witness, and how he knows the facts stated.

Do not fail to inscribe on each piece of evidence furnished, the soldier's name and service and the number of the claim.
