I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your office of application for Pension No. 150,574, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this office, that Bazil Kell was enrolled on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of October, 1863, at Calvert Md. in Co. "G", 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment of U.S. & Troops Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November, 1863, at Camp Stanton, Charles C. Ind. in Co. "G", 7<sup>th</sup> Regiment of U.S. & Troops Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the muster-roll of Co. "G", of that Regiment for the months of from organization (Nov 5, 1863) to August 31, 1864, he is reported "Present for duty" On Rolls from August 31, 1864 to February 28, 1865, "Absent sick" from February 28 to August 31, 1865, "Absent, wounded, since Sept 29, 1864" On Rolls from August 31, 1865, to August 31, 1866 - "Present for duty" - He was mustered out with Co. at Indiana, Texas, October 13, 1866 with remark "++ Absent wounded, from Sept 29, 1864 to Sept. 15, 1865" (Corpl.) -
